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Looking forward: future initiatives to boost/unlock the contribution of NWFP to sustainable development



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Some NWFP statistics & concepts:

- Total economic value of Mediterranean forests 133 Euro/ha (2001 prices)
- 35% of this value can be attributed to wood forest products, 10% to grazing and 9% to Non-Wood Forest Products (NWFPs)
- Socio-economic importance of NWFPs
- NWFPs provide raw materials for large-scale industrial processing including raw materials for internationally traded goods

Keep the concept of forestry to a mere wood and pulp supply chain is limiting







FAO recent activities for the development of NWFP

- Algeria: Cork, Medicinal and aromatics plants (MAP)
- Mauritania: Arabic gum, Jujube, Maera and baobab fruits,
 Cassia, henna, and Desmidorchis acutangula
- Morocco : Argan oil, rosemary
- Tunisia: Mastic tree oil, essential oil from rosemary and thyme
- Portugal: Cork oak (management and increased use of cork)
- Lebanon: Pinus pinea, Carob,





Call for Actions (1)

- Agadir commitment: NWFP can contribute to:
 - Provide sustainable value chain supporting FLR efforts
 - Increase resilience to climate change of Med forest ecosystems,
 - Promote and enhance food security in Med drylands







Call for Actions (2): Silva Mediterranea

- Platform to exchange on good practices in the Mediterranean;
 Support stakeholders to increase impact on the ground to achieve SDGs;
- Facilitator or catalyzer call for action to support viable NWFP value chains in all regions. Need for interregional partnerships to secure legal and sustainable value chains, knowledge exchange, data, good practices;
- NWFP Working Group possible platform to exchange information and facilitate partnerships
- Committed partner to support implementation of recommendations of workshops and White Paper





Looking to future initiatives

- Forest management plans need for an inventory of NWFP, allowing tracking;
- Branding and labeling, bioterritories;
- Creation of consortiums Exchange successful case studies;
- Favor private initiatives: Access to grants and credits;
- Design marketing strategies training and knowledge transferring - networking;





Looking to future initiatives

- Reducing regulative and administrative barriers: adopting trans-disciplinary and participatory governance approaches;
- Promoting citizens' engagement creating new job opportunities and new skills;
- New market opportunities for the economy (local and at European level) by mobilizing investments, also according to SDGs 1 "End poverty in all its forms everywhere" or "Reduce inequality within and among countries.
